**Map and Compass the Old Fashioned Way**

For your navigational enjoyment, a new and improved Map and Compass Course has been established in Edwin Warner Park. The challenge begins by figuring out the length of your individual paces, then by following pre-determined compass points and distances you search for etched aluminum plates set in the ground. The ultimate goal is to find each letter of a nature word, such as SKUNK, SNAKE, and more. There are five courses, or five words, all within the field just west of the main Edwin Warner Park entrance.

Friends of Warner Parks provided funds to purchase materials from Loftis Steel, while the welding of the spikes to the plates and the etching of the letters was professionally done by the Tennessee Technological Center in Nashville. Instructors and students graciously donated their time and expertise to this project and we are thrilled with the generosity and fine workmanship provided by the students. **Hill Forest Designated**

**Tennessee State Natural Area**

A milestone has been reached for the protection and preservation of the 324-acre Hill Forest with the news that the state legislature has designated 225 acres, containing the old growth forest, as a Tennessee State Natural Area. The House and Senate unanimously passed Senate Bill 3872 in March of 2010. Senator Douglas Henry, a sponsor of the bill, said “We must hold on to unique places like Hill Forest because we can’t recover them once they’re gone.”

Prior to the legislative action, a Memorandum of Agreement was written and signed by leaders of the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, and the Friends of Warner Parks to endorse and support a framework of cooperation for the designation. The MOA calls for Metro Parks and the Friends of Warner Parks (FOWP) to complete a Hill Forest Resource Management Plan in consultation with the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation within two years.

Brian Bowen, Administrator of the Tennessee Natural Areas Program, was assisted by Warner Parks staff and FOWP volunteers in recommending the boundary of the designated natural area. In a letter related to his assessment of the site’s natural area qualities, Bowen said “The occurrence of old growth forest in Davidson County is extremely unique.”

In July of 2009, the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation approved the acquisition of the 324 acre Hill property, along with an additional 124 acres that had previously been purchased by the Friends of Warner Parks. This outstanding preservation effort to “Save the Ancient Forest” has been nominated for the 2010 Governor’s Environmental Stewardship Award in the category of Natural Heritage Conservation.

## Goin' APES with local High Schools!

In 1990, a partnership was formed with Hillwood High School's Ecology and Advanced Placement Environmental Science classes. Warner Parks provided a living laboratory, complete with naturalist guides, for the classes to learn and explore outdoors on a bi-monthly basis. Outdoor laboratory topics included water quality, bird banding research, watershed mapping, and geology of middle Tennessee.



Today, our Naturalists provide field experiences for Martin Luther King Magnet, Hume Fogg Academic Magnet, Hillwood and Ensworth High Schools, providing outdoor labs for students throughout the school year.

Warner Park Nature Center has always been supported by students. Here are just a few of the projects local high schools have been involved with through the years:

- \* Hillwood High School students built the Owl Hollow Trail in the 1970s.
- \* Ensworth High School freshmen have removed exotic plants along the Natchez Trace for the last 5 years.
- \* Montgomery Bell Academy students adopted a part of the park (near Dripping Springs) and maintained it for the last 20 years.
- \* Harpeth Hall has participated in history service learning projects at the Parks' cemeteries for over 10 years.
- \* Father Ryan, Hillsboro, Hillwood and Hume Fogg High School students have volunteered at children's educational events for many years.

## Eleanor Willis Receives Special Conservation Honors

The Cumberland Chapter of the Daughters of the Revolution met April 21 at Hillwood Country Club. A Conservation Medal was presented by the National Society of the DAR to Eleanor Willis, Executive Director of the Friends of Warner Parks, for the work that was done by her organization to purchase the 324 acre Hill tract, containing an old growth forest. The tract will soon be turned over to the Metropolitan Board of Parks and Recreation, and will become part of Edwin Warner Park.

### Tennessee Every Child Outdoors Coalition

The TN Every Child Outdoors Coalition (ECO TN) was established in November of 2008 at a meeting of stakeholders from across the state held at the Warner Park Nature Center in Nashville. The mission of ECO TN is to promote and support opportunities that encourage children to engage with and experience the outdoors. ECO TN has over 100 active supporting members from organizations, agencies, and businesses.

With recent concerns about youth detachment from the outdoors, lack of physical exercise and increased health risks, Tennessee's Every Child Outdoors Coalition has adopted the Tennessee Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights (TCOBOR). A formal Resolution supporting the work of the ECO-TN Coalition and establishing the TCOBOR was unanimously passed by the Tennessee General Assembly in February 2010 and signed by Governor Bredesen on March 22, 2010.

The Tennessee Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights states that every child, before entering high school, should have the opportunity to:
